| Summary:      | Apurinic/apyrimidinic (AP) sites occur frequently in DNA molecules by spontaneous<br>hydrolysis, by DNA damaging agents or by DNA glycosylases that remove specific abnormal<br>bases. AP sites are pre-mutagenic lesions that can prevent normal DNA replication so the cell<br>contains systems to identify and repair such sites. Class II AP endonucleases cleave the<br>phosphodiester backbone 5' to the AP site. This gene encodes a protein shown to have a<br>weak class II AP endonuclease activity. Most of the encoded protein is located in the nucleus<br>but some is also present in mitochondria. This protein may play an important role in both<br>nuclear and mitochondrial base excision repair. Alternatively spliced transcript variants<br>encoding multiple isoforms have been observed for this gene. [provided by RefSeq, Nov |


