## Troponin C1 (TNNC1) (NM\_003280) Human Tagged ORF Clone Lentiviral Particle - RC207014L1V

**Gene Summary:** Troponin is a central regulatory protein of striated muscle contraction, and together with

tropomyosin, is located on the actin filament. Troponin consists of 3 subunits: Tnl, which is the inhibitor of actomyosin ATPase; TnT, which contains the binding site for tropomyosin; and TnC, the protein encoded by this gene. The binding of calcium to TnC abolishes the inhibitory action of Tnl, thus allowing the interaction of actin with myosin, the hydrolysis of

ATP, and the generation of tension. Mutations in this gene are associated with

cardiomyopathy dilated type 1Z. [provided by RefSeq, Oct 2008]
