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Gene Summary:This gene encodes a protein that is part of a post-splicing multiprotein complex involved in<br/>both mRNA nuclear export and mRNA surveillance. mRNA surveillance detects exported<br/>mRNAs with truncated open reading frames and initiates nonsense-mediated mRNA decay<br/>(NMD). When translation ends upstream from the last exon-exon junction, this triggers NMD<br/>to degrade mRNAs containing premature stop codons. This protein is located only in the<br/>cytoplasm. When translation ends, it interacts with the protein that is a functional homolog of<br/>yeast Upf2p to trigger mRNA decapping. Use of multiple polyadenylation sites has been<br/>noted for this gene.
