

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

	The molecular sequence of this clone aligns with the gene accession number as a point of reference only. However, individual transcript sequences of the same gene can differ through naturally occurring variations (e.g. polymorphisms), each with its own valid existence. This clone is substantially in agreement with the reference, but a complete review of all prevailing variants is recommended prior to use. <u>More info</u>
OTI Annotation:	This clone was engineered to express the complete ORF with an expression tag. Expression varies depending on the nature of the gene.
Components:	The ORF clone is ion-exchange column purified and shipped in a 2D barcoded Matrix tube containing 10ug of transfection-ready, dried plasmid DNA (reconstitute with 100 ul of water).
Reconstitution Metho	<ul> <li>d: 1. Centrifuge at 5,000xg for 5min.</li> <li>2. Carefully open the tube and add 100ul of sterile water to dissolve the DNA.</li> <li>3. Close the tube and incubate for 10 minutes at room temperature.</li> <li>4. Briefly vortex the tube and then do a quick spin (less than 5000xg) to concentrate the liquid at the bottom.</li> <li>5. Store the suspended plasmid at -20°C. The DNA is stable for at least one year from date of shipping when stored at -20°C.</li> </ul>

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
## SAP70 (NM\_001079) Human Tagged Lenti ORF Clone – RC208838L1

Gene Summary:This gene encodes an enzyme belonging to the protein tyrosine kinase family, and it plays a<br/>role in T-cell development and lymphocyte activation. This enzyme, which is phosphorylated<br/>on tyrosine residues upon T-cell antigen receptor (TCR) stimulation, functions in the initial<br/>step of TCR-mediated signal transduction in combination with the Src family kinases, Lck and<br/>Fyn. This enzyme is also essential for thymocyte development. Mutations in this gene cause<br/>selective T-cell defect, a severe combined immunodeficiency disease characterized by a<br/>selective absence of CD8-positive T-cells. Two transcript variants that encode different<br/>isoforms have been found for this gene. [provided by RefSeq, Jul 2008]
