

Gene Summary:This gene encodes a protein that belongs to the carbonic anhydrase family of zinc<br/>metalloenzymes, which catalyze the reversible hydration of carbon dioxide in various<br/>biological processes. The protein encoded by this gene is an acatalytic member of the alpha-<br/>carbonic anhydrase subgroup, and it is thought to play a role in the central nervous system,<br/>especially in brain development. Multiple transcript variants encoding the same protein have<br/>been found for this gene. [provided by RefSeq, Jul 2008]
