

OTI Annotation:

This clone was engineered to express the complete ORF with an expression tag. Expression

varies depending on the nature of the gene.

Components:

The ORF clone is ion-exchange column purified and shipped in a 2D barcoded Matrix tube containing 10ug of transfection-ready, dried plasmid DNA (reconstitute with 100 ul of water).

Note:

Plasmids are not sterile. For experiments where strict sterility is required, filtration with

0.22um filter is required.

Gene Summary: This gene was identified as a tumor suppressor that is mutated in a large number of cancers

at high frequency. The protein encoded by this gene is a phosphatidylinositol-3,4,5-trisphosphate 3-phosphatase. It contains a tensin like domain as well as a catalytic domain similar to that of the dual specificity protein tyrosine phosphatases. Unlike most of the protein tyrosine phosphatases, this protein preferentially dephosphorylates phosphoinositide

substrates. It negatively regulates intracellular levels of phosphatidylinositol-3,4,5-

trisphosphate in cells and functions as a tumor suppressor by negatively regulating AKT/PKB signaling pathway. The use of a non-canonical (CUG) upstream initiation site produces a longer isoform that initiates translation with a leucine, and is thought to be preferentially associated with the mitochondrial inner membrane. This longer isoform may help regulate energy metabolism in the mitochondria. A pseudogene of this gene is found on chromosome

9. Alternative splicing and the use of multiple translation start codons results in multiple
