| Reconstitution Method: | <ol> <li>Centrifuge at 5,000xg for 5min.</li> <li>Carefully open the tube and add 100ul of sterile water to dissolve the DNA.</li> <li>Close the tube and incubate for 10 minutes at room temperature.</li> <li>Briefly vortex the tube and then do a quick spin (less than 5000xg) to concentrate the liquid at the bottom.</li> <li>Store the suspended plasmid at -20°C. The DNA is stable for at least one year from date of shipping when stored at -20°C.</li> </ol>   |

| Gene Summary:          | Histones play a critical role in transcriptional regulation, cell cycle progression, and<br>developmental events. Histone acetylation/deacetylation alters chromosome structure and<br>affects transcription factor access to DNA. The protein encoded by this gene belongs to class I<br>of the histone deacetylase family. It catalyzes the deacetylation of lysine residues in the<br>histone N-terminal tails and represses transcription in large multiprotein complexes with<br>transcriptional co-repressors. Multiple transcript variants encoding different isoforms have<br>been found for this gene. [provided by RefSeq, Oct 2009]<br>Transcript Variant: This variant (6) lacks multiple alternate coding exons and uses an alternate<br>3' terminal exon, compared to variant 1. The encoded isoform (3) maintains the reading<br>frame, but is shorter and has a distinct C-terminus, compared to isoform 1. Sequence Note: A<br>downstream translational start codon is selected for this RefSeq based on a strong Kozak<br>signal and transcript support. An upstream in-frame start codon is also present but has a<br>weaker Kozak signal and sparse transcript support. Use of the upstream start codon would<br>result in a protein that is 38 aa longer at the N-terminus. Leaky scanning by ribosomes may<br>allow translation initiation at the downstream start codon, which is supported by 5'RACE<br>experiments described in PubMed: 10922473 and encodes a protein with an N-terminus<br>similar to other family members. |

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
