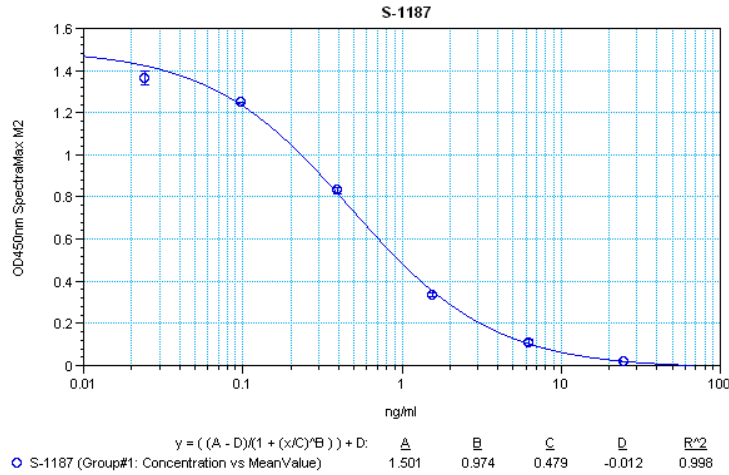

Formulation:	Neat undiluted antiserum, lyophilized, packaged under nitrogen. Reconstitute by adding 50µl distilled water. This will give the equivalent of undiluted antiserum.

Conjugation:	Unconjugated
Storage:	Original vial: at least one year at 4° - 8°C from date of delivery. Minimize repeated thawing and freezing of the antiserum by freezing aliquots at -20°C or below.

Background:	Amylin (also known as islet amyloid polypeptide (IAPP)) is a 37-amino acid peptide hormone with a disulfide bridge between cysteine residue 2 and 7. Both the amidated C-terminus and the disulfide bridge are necessary for the full biological activity of Amylin. It is co-secreted with insulin from the pancreatic β-cells and plays an important role in the glycemic control, regulating it by slowing gastric emptying and promoting satiety. It is also involved in bone metabolism, along with the related peptides calcitonin and calcitonin gene related peptide. This antibody was generated by immunization of rabbits with Amylin coupled to a carrier protein.
