Buffer: Provided lyophilized from a 0.2 µm filtered solution of 20 mM Tris-HCl, 150 mM NaCl

Endotoxin: less than 0.1 ng/μg (1 EU/μg) as determined by TAL test.

Reconstitution Method: It is not recommended to reconstitute to a concentration less than 100µg/ml. Dissolve the

lyophilized protein in distilled water. Please aliquot the reconstituted solution to minimize

freeze-thaw cycles.

Note: Apparant Molecular Weight: 18.4 - 25kDa

Storage: Lyophilized protein should be stored at below -20°C, though stable at room temperature for

3 weeks.

Reconstituted protein solution can be stored at 4-7°C for 2-7 days if immediately used, but

should be stored in aliquotes at below -20°C for extended storage.

Always centrifuge tubes before opening. Do not mix by vortex or pipetting.

Stability: Aliquots of reconstituted samples are stable at below -20°C for 3 months. Avoid repeat freeze

and thaw.

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
Summary:

The product of this gene is a membrane protein expressed on the oligodendrocyte cell surface and the outermost surface of myelin sheaths. Due to this localization, it is a primary target antigen involved in immune-mediated demyelination. This protein may be involved in completion and maintenance of the myelin sheath and in cell-cell communication. Alternatively spliced transcript variants encoding different isoforms have been identified. [provided by RefSeq, Jul 2008]
