Tag: His Tag (C-term)

Predicted MW: The protein has a calculated MW of 18.17 kDa. The protein migrates as 18 kDa under

reducing condition (SDS-PAGE analysis).

Purity: >98% as determined by SDS-PAGE.

Buffer: The protein was lyophilized from a 0.2 μm filtered solution containing 1X PBS, pH 7.4.

Bioactivity: Measure by its ability to induce IL-8 secretion in human PBMCs. The ED₅₀ for this effect is <0.2

ng/mL.

Endotoxin: $< 0.1 \text{ EU per 1} \mu \text{g of the protein by the LAL method.}$

Reconstitution Method: Centrifuge at 3000 rpm for 5 mins before opening. It is recommended to reconstitute the

lyophilized protein in sterile H_2O to a concentration not less than 100 $\mu g/mL$ and incubate the stock solution at room temperature for at least 20 mins to ensure sufficient re-dissolved.

Do Not Vortex! Vigorous shaking may impair the biological activity of the protein.

Applications: Cell culture

Storage: Lyophilized protein should be stored at -20°C for 1 year. Upon reconstitution, store at 2°C to

8°C for up to 1 week. Further dilute in a buffer containing a carrier protein or stabilizer (e.g. 0.1% BSA, 10%FBS, 5%HSA or 5% trehalose solution), protein aliquots should be stored at -

20°C or -80°C for 3-6 months. Avoid repeated freeze/thaw cycles.






Summary:

Interleukin-36 beta (IL-36 β) is an 18 kDa cytokine with 154 amino acid residues. IL-36 β , the ligand of IL-36R, is expressed in keratinocytes and plays a significant role in inflammatory responses. IL-36 β regulates biological functions like the differentiation of T cells. Moreover, IL-36 β recruits neutrophils via inducing the expression of cytokines and chemokines, such as IL-17C, granulocyte colony-stimulating factor (G-CSF), IL-8, CXCL-1, and tumor necrosis factor (TNF).
