Lentiviruses are a subset of retroviruses, able to integrate into host chromosomes, and to infect nondividing cells. More recent generation vectors have been designed to diminish possible recombination resulting in a wild type- potentially infectious virus. It is usually recommended that work with nonhuman lentiviruses that are incapable of establishing productive infections in humans be conducted at BSL-2.
